





As parliamentarian, you must maintain a position of impartiality. The parliamentarian does not make motions, participate in debate, or vote on any question except in the case of a ballot vote.

The parliamentarian of the chapter serves as principal advisor to the Basileus, chapter officers, and committees in the interpretation of the National Constitution and Bylaws, the Manual of Policies and Procedures, Regional and Chapter Bylaws.


Where no other procedure is specified in the sorority documents, refer to the Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised (12<sup>th</sup> edition now). Remember, the National Constitution and Bylaws and other Sorority documents, supersede the chapter bylaws, regional bylaws and Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised.

Let's start the year off **not** using such statements as: Protocol having been established and I so move.

Remember, according to the documents, Section XI page 7 of the MPP, the Basileus is an ex-officio member of all committees except for the Audit and Nominations Committees. She shall be made aware of committee meetings and may attend at her convenience.
